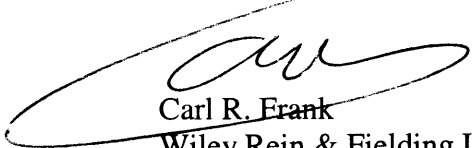

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Pursuant to Section 1.46 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.46 (2003),
Aeronautical Radio Inc. ("ARINC") hereby requests a two week extension of time to reply to
The Boeing Co. and Rockwell Collins Corporation. On September 13, 2004, Boeing and
Rockwell filed informal objections to the above-captioned experimental license. Pursuant to
Section 1.41 of the Commissions' Rules, ARINC's response normally would be due on
September 28, 2004. Because of the unavailability of key personnel and the need thoroughly to
investigate the issues raised by Boeing and Rockwell, ARINC requests a two-week extension of

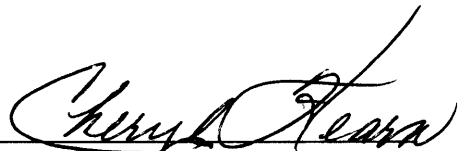
