This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Conditions:

- (2) The station identification requirements of Section 5.115 of the Commission's Rules are waived.
- (3) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (4) All customers participating in the experiment shall be informed that this operation is for experimental purposes only and can be cancelled at any time.
- (5) Prior to equipment authorization or a determination of compliance, the device must be accompanied by a conspicuous notice worded as follows: "This device has not been authorized as required by the rules of the Federal Communications Commission. This device is not, and may not be, offered for sale or lease, or sold or leased, until authorization is obtained."
- (6) Licensee must respond to interference complaints in a timely manner.
- (7) This license authorizes the use of no more than 5 units at any time.
- (8) Licensee is required to file a PROGRESS REPORT at the completion of testing. - (9) The PROGRESS REPORT should include, but is not limited to, a description of measurements and results demonstrating compliance with Part 15.109.
- (10) CISPR quasi-peak measurements are to be taken in the linear mode only.
