Re: Request for Expedited Review for 0008-EX-ST-2008

Dear Mr. Burtle

On behalf of The United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM), the Oklahoma State University Multi-spectral Laboratory (OSU-UML) has immediate need for review of our applications for Special Temporary Authority for experimental broadcasts in the L frequency bands, which are pending with your office.

USSOCOM is developing a very small synthetic aperture radar (SAR) in an ACTD project with Trident Systems, Incorporated. Trident wishes to test its SAR radar at both the Chilocco, Oklahoma test site (for which the FCC has granted licenses for NAVAIR tests of the SOCOM PSYOPS equipment), and at a new UAV test facility OSU-UML is establishing next to the Fort Sill, Oklahoma gunnery ranges. The OSU-UML seeks an STA necessary to execute test activities in direct support of USSOCOM.

Testing commencement is now projected for early February, 2008.

Once the testing and training is actually completed, the systems will be delivered to USSOCOM for deployment in support of ongoing operations associated with Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraq Freedom (OIF), and further required operations.





Because of the operational demands of USSOCOM, we hereby request expedited priority on the following FCC application for the STA filed two days ago on January 8, 2008:
