This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Temporary Authority is hereby granted to operate the apparatus described below:

Purpose Of Operation:

Flight testing of two funded airship platforms are planned. Airships will ascend from ground level and operate at a nominal cruise altitude of 60,000 to 65,000 ft.

Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) Stop Buzzer: Frank Sneeringer, (302) 593-1588, fs@sceye.com.
- (4) Sceye may not operate in the 2367-2387 MHz band in order to protect ongoing federal operations.
- (5) Operations must be scheduled with the Department of Defense (DoD) Area Frequency Coordinator - White Sands Missile Range (AFC-WSMR) office, at least 96 hours prior to each launch, via e-mail to usarmy.wsmr.imcom-central.list.dodafc@mail.mil.
- (6) The high-altitude balloon shall not overfly DoD restricted airspaces at White Sands Missile Range (R5103, R5107, R5109, R5111, and R5119), and Cannon AFB-Melrose Range (R5104 and R5105).
- (7) Should Sceye operations conflict with a DoD mission, the AFC-WSMR will contact the Sceye POC, and request that Sceye stand down their operations, or select an alternate frequency, if possible.
- (8) Unwanted emission power from operation in the 1429-1452 MHz frequency band shall be limited to -28 dBW in the 1400-1427 MHz frequency band for aeronautical telemetry stations, in accordance with ITU Resolution 750 (WRC-19).
- (9) Frequency assignment(s) in the bands of 1435-1525 MHz and 2360-2395 MHz must be coordinated prior to authorization with the Area Frequency Coordinator (AFC), who also coordinates, as appropriate, with Aerospace and Flight Test Radio Coordinating Council. Use of these frequencies under the authority is subject to such further coordination with the AFC to ensure compatibility with existing users.
- (10) Operations are non-interference basis to Flight Test telemetry and Air Force Spectrum Dependent System
