- (7) Department of Defense is not responsible for coordinating or obtaining INMARSAT and US Permitted Space Station access agreements required for any testing/ demonstration under this authorization.
- (8) Grant of this authorization is without prejudice to any determination that the Commission may make regarding pending or future applications.
- (9) All Boeing operations granted on an experimental basis shall be conducted on an unprotected, non-interference basis to authorized Department of Defense stations.
- (10) The Boeing Company must successfully coordinate with the affected Fixed Microwave Service licensees in adjacent band 27.5-29.5 GHz, around each test site prior to commencing the experimental operations.
- (11) Prior to operation, the Boeing Company must coordinate with stations authorized to operate in these frequency bands that are located within a 25-mile radius of the transmitter.
- (12) Experimental station shall use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links to minimize potential interference to licensed users.
- (13) The authorized station must be in compliance with environmental requirement set forth in Section 1.1307 of the Commission's Rules.
- (14) The authorized station must be in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements as set forth in Section 17.4 of the Commission's Rules.
- (15) This authorization is without prejudice to any determination that the Commission may make regarding pending or future experimental satellite earth station applications.
- (16) Operations are on a non-interference basis (NIB) and shall not cause harmful interference to, and shall not claim protection from, interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station and it shall cease transmission(s) immediately upon notice of such interference and notify the FCC in writing.
