(Transtelco), to Transtelco Holding Inc. (THI)**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

LatinGroup LLC (“LatinGroup”) respectfully requests that the Commission take the necessary actions to suspend the Streamlined International Application **ITC-T/C-20150112-00008** filed by Transtelco Inc according to the Public Comment period ending on February 27, 2015 and open a larger review of the details of its application to transfer control of the company. We seek an indefinite suspension of the request of the transfer of control, although already realized by the company.

We herein submit an historical brief to show that the assets Transtelco seeks to transfer to a new entity are in fact sole propriety of LatinGroup and in fact were such since 2007 when Transtelco first filed it’s Section 214 (FCC File No. ITC-214-20070228—00088). Furthermore, LatinGroup’s ownership existed at the time of Transtelco’s subsequent incorporation of Transtelco Holding Inc., the investment by Axiscom in 2007 and additional investment by Finestra S.A. de C.V. in 2012. The later investment was in fact by a related entity insomuch as it’s controlling shareholder, Fernando de Jesus Fernandez Clariond wholly controlled WLCOM S.A. de C.V., a previous owner of the company that Transtelco Inc acquired contain the assets in question including circuits 7 & 8.

As Managing Member of LatinGroup, I emphatically state to the Commission that LatinGroup owns the assets known as Circuits 7 & 8, as corroborated by the exhibits to this Ex Parte.

It is our request that the statements and corroborating exhibits be included into the above-referenced docket. We further present to the Commission that Transtelco, with related parties, seeks to petition the United States Federal Communications Commission to transfer assets and obtained rights it



does not own, to a new company and uninhibited entity for the purpose to protect the assets and rights from federal prosecution.

LatinGroup petitions the Commission to recognize its ownership of Circuits 7 & 8 evidenced by exhibit 2.
